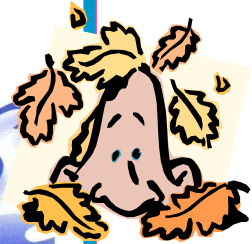

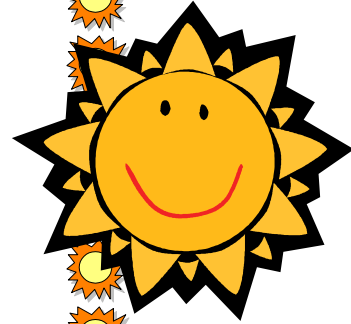

After we turn in the canoes, we can meet for supper at a location to be announced later - I won't know where until Thursday.

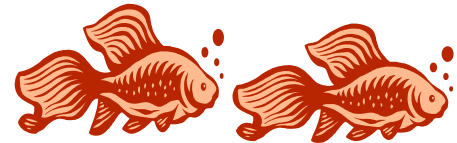

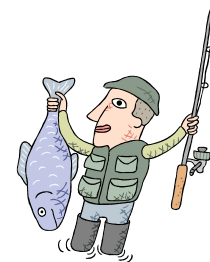

Here are the fun details for our wine tour Friday Oct. 1, - Sun. Oct. 3rd

Itinerary

Friday—October 1st

** Friday evening arrive in Richland; (unfortunately there is not enough of us to add a tour for Walla Walla). We are checking out casual restaurants and small wineries to see where we can gather. We are planning on a dinner for 730 p.m. for those who can make it. After dinner we will meet as a group to socialize, pick up maps, schedules, etc. (get organized) at our hotel.

Saturday—October 2nd

** At 9:30 a.m., Kent Waliser, General Manager of Sagemoor Group and a Washington Wine Commissioner will personally take us out to look at his vineyards. He has selected a spot with a magnificent view of the area (about 600 feet above sea level) and where we can actually see marble rock formations that reflect flooding that shaped the area. (located in Pasco, 30 minutes from our hotel in Richland and 25 minutes from the RV Camp—see below for more details about hotels and RV location).

After that we will stop in at a Pasco winery, Balcom & Moe (waiting for confirmation) from 11am-12n.

Lunch will be at a favorite place for those who went on the tour last year, Hightower Winery in Benton City in the Red Mountain AVA area. Tim has agreed to cater a picnic lunch (price in my next update) and in addition to the tasting, will give us a talk about his winery and discuss what it takes to produce quality wines.

At about 2:30 we will leave and visit two small wineries on the same road, Sandhill and Buckmaster Cellars (again, waiting for confirmation), spending about an hour at each.

For those who need a break, there will be time to return to the hotel in Richland before we have our party later in the evening.

Fidelitas winery is on the way to our evening event and I have called to make arrangements for a visit for those who still have the stamina.

At 6:30pm Victor Cruz at Canon Del Sol in Benton City (which is the same town as Hightower) will host us for a party. He reconfirmed that we will have a wine tasting, authentic and excellent Mexican food along with Mexican music for about \$25.00 per person.

Sunday—October 3rd

On Sunday for those of us heading back toward Seattle, we have three options in Prosser which is about 30 minutes West of Richland. We can drop in to the winery. They are expecting us—nook Winery in Prosser can welcome us at Crest winery in Prosser to cater a picnic growing crops and grapes for approxi-

Hotel and RV Information

I have blocked rooms at the Red Lion in Richland. The rate is \$69 per night and that includes Breakfast (at no charge up to a \$10 meal). They will be providing me with a menu that will stay within that allowance. They will also give us a separate area in the dining room for our group. In addition, Bob and I will stay in one room with a patio for \$79 per night and there is room blocked next to ours with the same set-up. If one of our members could reserve that room, we will have space to hold a meeting on Friday and a place to gather anytime we choose over the weekend. For the Friday evening gathering we can bring our own snacks, beer and wine.



They will hold the rooms until Sept. 14th without a guarantee from me. So, please make your reservations as soon as possible and say you are with the Puget Sound Yacht Club. If anyone wishes to book the room next to mine, call reservations and say the two rooms are: 186, 187.

The Red Lion Reservation number is: 509 946 7611 or 800 Red Lion. I worked with Jamaica Todd if there are any questions.

Less than 10 minutes away is the **Sandy Hills RV Park** and I will have a confirmation from the manager about the rate they will offer us, depending upon the size of the group. It will be approximately \$26.00 per night. They will want to place us in the same area. To reserve your spot, **phone 509 542 1357**. Since the manager was out, I will need to reconfirm the details in the next few days, so please wait to make your reservation until next week.

Let me know if you would like to help with:

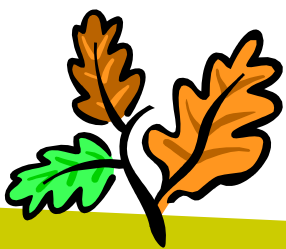
Organizing the vehicle and traveling schedules. Some folks might like to convoy or share a vehicle.

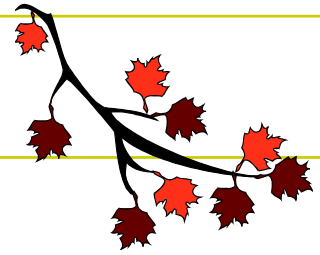
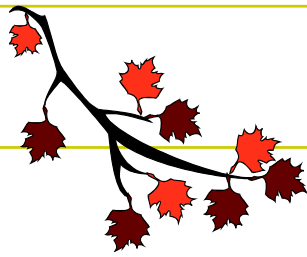
Or, if you would just like to help, that would be good to know.

In my next update I will have more details about the events and costs of the meals. I will arrange to have maps, information, etc. at the September meeting and I will bring more information to Richland.

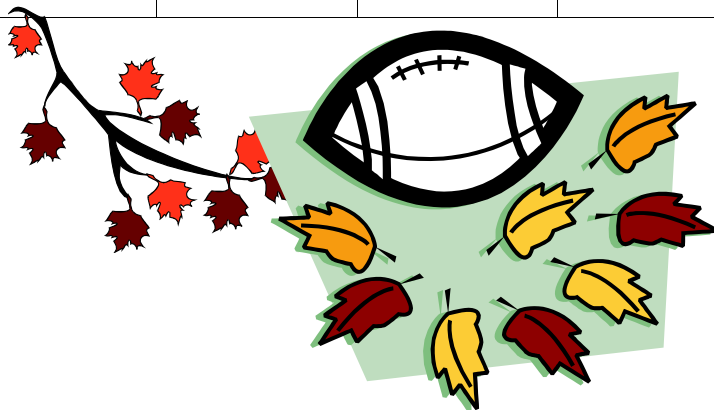

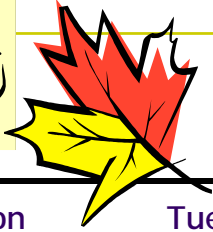
