Vice Commodore's Report - Barry Ellingson

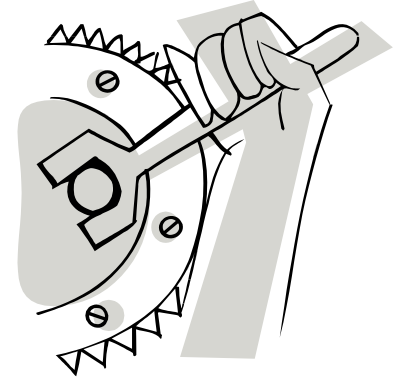
