



Commodore's Report—Mike Haistings

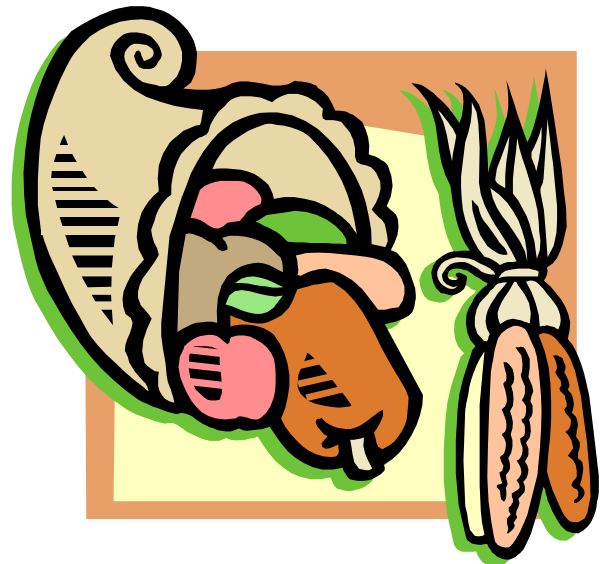
