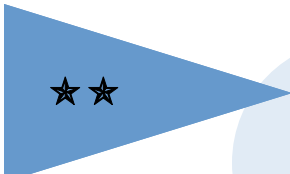

Wow! What a busy month April was. How do we manage?

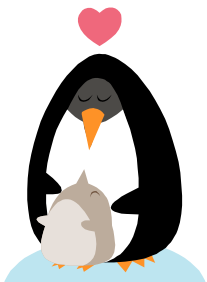

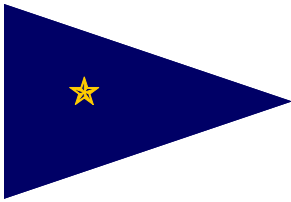
Speaking of which, I have a gallon of paint specially designated for the galley walls. Anyone want to volunteer to help me paint the galley?

WOW! Another Opening Day Celebration is almost here.

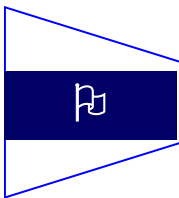
Each year I look forward to attending the Ceremonies at the Club. If you have not been, you are really missing a lot. Please come and participate in the fun you will be glad you did.

## Fleet Captain's Report - Chris Kullman

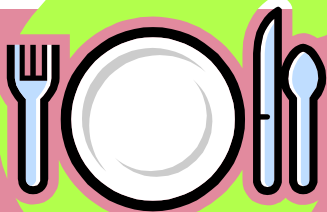

And programs which take full charge of tacking during beats.

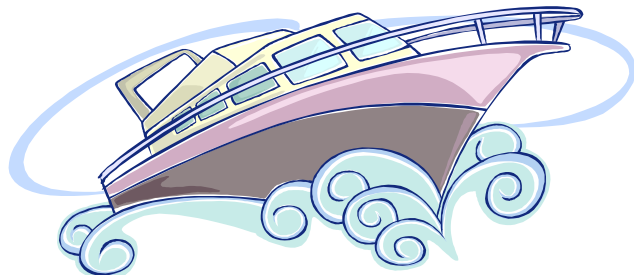
I must go down to the sea again, and not leave friends behind,
