Upstairs Remodel

Dock Expansion

Mike and I met with a representative from the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe regarding our permit to extend our dock. We have revised the original plan for the extension to respond to concerns from the Tribe about the distance that we were extending into the Lake. The Tribe has approved of our current plan, although as a part of their approval they are asking us to sign an agreement that the Club will maintain a \$10,000 fund to pay for any damage to the fishing nets set out in the vicinity

of our dock from our members' boats. The nets are typically set out from mid-September through October and for a short period around the first of July. We are obviously not responsible for damage to their nets from the "Ducks" and boats that are not a part of our Club.
