Awards Dinner: Our annual Awards dinner will be Wednesday, December 16th at 6:00 at the Clubhouse. This is the chance for the Club to recognize the participation of Members for all of their hard work over the past year. As a volunteer organization the success of the Club depends upon the support of its members. In putting together the award certificates I am amazed how many members spend so much time in supporting the Club's activities. The event will also include the Change of Watch to induct our new Bridge and Trustees for the coming year.

Budget: The Board has been working on the budget for next year. As required by the by-laws it will be presented to the General Membership at the January meeting for approval. While it hasn't been finalized by the Board, the expenses anticipated for next year are less than in years past because of the settlement of the Hat Island issue. As a result it will take less income to balance the budget. It has been suggested that the yearly dues be reduced to \$250 per person. This will still allow us to have a profit at the end of the year. The issue of whether the dues should be reduced, left the same or even increased as was approved in a 5-year plan three years ago was "discussed" at the November's General meeting. The intent of the 5-year plan was to increase reserves for future improvements to the Club House. There was a lot of passionate discussion on both sides. While the budget will be presented by Tim as the new Commodore and the new Board, I would suggest the Membership approve the budget which represents the proposed expenses and make a separate decision regarding what the dues should be for next year which will dictate the revenue and potential profit.

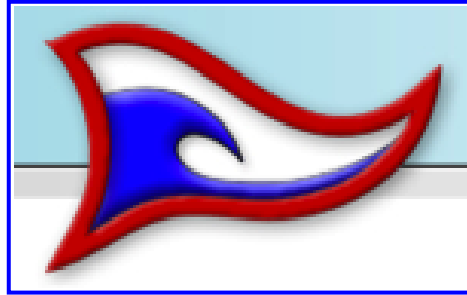
Fleet Captain's Report – Robert Murphy
