Resolution: I will work with Pat to identify a refrigeration company that can come out and evaluate the cost of repair. The board will decide next steps depending on costs.

Jerry's comments "I went out to the club the other day and cleaned up the 2 BBQ's (including the one with baked salmon skin from last Fall). The "electric starts" worked just fine and all 5 burners on each worked fine. Got the temp. up to 450 degrees in 7-8 minutes. I filled up 3 of the empty propane tanks, so everything is full. There are 4 full spare tanks in the shed. If the Board wants to replace the BBQ's later, I would suggest Spring-Fall when they're on sale."

We are still thick in the middle of winter but, the cruising season kicks off in 9 weeks!

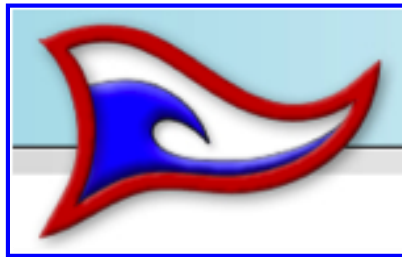
