Project Status

Here is the status of Club Improvement Projects that we have going on:

- **Club PA System repair.** The board voted at the February meeting to stop repairing the old PA system and replace it with a new one, including new speakers. A new Microphone receiver was purchased in January, but we could never get it to work with the old system.

*I am happy to report that as of February 26th, the new PA system has been installed and working! The old speakers were also removed and replaced with newer, more powerful ones that produce better sound and work extremely well with the new microphones {No annoying feedback!!!}

- **Security upgrades to Clubhouse fence/gate.** The new hinged spring has been received by Robert Murphy and he is planning on testing it out soon. Once this is installed, it should keep the clubhouse side gate from staying open after someone closes it.
- **Security Camera Survey Completed.** Following my camera survey of the property to determine the positions for mounting cameras, the field of vision and how to wire all of this to a secure room, the board approved to purchase a Reolink 4K, 8 camera surveillance system with NVR recorder. This system is badly needed as security events in the past year have increased and the need to protect our property and its members has become an immediate goal. I have received and tested the unit at home, with plans to begin work on installing it in early March. Any work not completed by April 1st will be included in the Spring Work Party on April 30th. It should be noted that although this system comes with only 8 cameras, it is designed to support up to 16.

Please consider joining Robert & Adrienne at the upcoming Daffodil Festival, put on by the Tacoma Yacht Club.




